



Stop NHS cuts

Government says there is more money than ever for the NHS. So why are there record long waits for treatment in hospital and with your GP?

Government says there is only a little privatisation. 30% of community health services contracts are held by Virgin Care, with profits going to tax havens.

Government says we need fewer hospital beds so it is OK to sell off NHS land to private developers. Ambulances often wait in car-parks because NO BEDS are available for their patients.

What is happening to the NHS in Islington?

- Land at the Whittington Hospital to be sold for a re-build of mental health beds currently at St Pancras - but with no planned increase in the number of beds despite a growing population and more mental illness.
- GPs cannot send you for many treatments until you can prove you have been in severe pain for months
- Profits from land sales will pay off hospital deficits - and government avoids the blame for NHS under-funding
- Islington NHS decision-makers are forced to give savings away to outer London boroughs which are in deficit
